



PRESIDENT'S PAGE



I'm writing this column just after the mid-January blizzard, and we still have seven-foot snow drifts blocking our driveway. Naturally, I thought this would be a perfect time to continue my discussion of how birds tolerate winter cold! I'll begin by reviewing the physiological adjustments that birds make to winter cold and finish with behavioral adjustments.

Because they maintain a constant high body temperature (usually about 41° C, or 106° F) under most circumstances, as air temperature drops, birds must increase heat production. Birds do this primarily, if not exclusively, by shivering. They shiver isometrically, which means that opposing muscle groups work against



each other. This has the advantage of creating very little movement on the body surface, causing little disruption of the surface insulation layer, so that warm air stays near the body surface. This contrasts with shivering in mammals, where muscle tremors produce marked disturbance of the surface insulation layer. Winter birds typically exhibit increased shivering endurance (and, consequently, cold resistance) compared to their summer counterparts. For example, winter American Goldfinches in Michigan tolerated exposure to -70° C (-94° F) for 6-8 hours or more, while summer birds became hypothermic in less than one hour (Dawson, W. R. and C. Carey. 1976. Seasonal acclimatization to temperature in Cardueline finches. I. Insulative and metabolic adjustments, J. Comp. Physiol. 112:317-333). The physiological and biochemical mechanisms responsible for this winter improvement in cold resistance are incompletely understood, but appear to involve changes in carbohydrate and fat metabolism (an increased reliance on fat in winter), in size of the flight muscles (increased mass in winter), and in the ability of the blood to carry oxygen to working muscles (increased capacity to carry oxygen in winter).

Most small birds wintering in cold climates also show elevated maximal capacity for heat production in winter relative to summer. Summer to winter increases in capacity for heat production range from 16% for American Goldfinches in Michigan to about 50% in Downy Woodpeckers and White-breasted Nuthatches from South Dakota. The

significance of this winter increase in maximal capacity for heat production to winter improvement of cold resistance is not certain, but increased maximal capacities are closely correlated with improved endurance at suboptimal levels of heat production. Basal metabolic rate (BMR, or minimal resting metabolic rate) also increases in winter, compared to summer in many, but not all, small birds wintering in cold climates, Winter increases in BMR suggest higher energy costs associated with maintenance of thermogenic tissues (muscles) and support tissues involved in supplying energy and oxygen to shivering muscles (gut, heart, liver, etc.). Interestingly, the very few birds studied to date show winter increases in the mass of both heat producing and support tissues.

Another interesting physiological adaptation to cold for a number of birds is the use of regulated hypothermia and torpor. Body temperature in most small birds drops by about 2-3° C at night (less for larger birds), but some birds can allow body temperature to drop more markedly. Some birds, including Black-capped Chickadees and a few other tits, show a nighttime reduction in body temperature of 10-12° C (18-22° F) below daytime levels. This is known as regulated hypothermia, and acts to reduce the difference in temperature between the bird and its environment, This, in turn, reduces the flow of heat from bird to environment and markedly lowers energy costs for regulation of body temperature. Indeed, Black-capped Chickadees in New York save up to 32% on overnight energy expenditures for thermoregulation when using regulated hypothermia. Chickadees are still capable of activity and flight at these reduced body temperatures.

More extreme cases of body temperature reduction for saving energy occur in such birds as hummingbirds, swifts, and goatsuckers. These birds enter nightly torpor under conditions of cold and food deprivation. In the torpid state, these birds become unresponsive to stimuli. Body temperature approaches environmental temperature down to certain levels (usually about 5-15° C (41-60° F). This results in substantial energy savings for the same reasons as in regulated hypothermia. Neither regulated hypothermia nor torpor result from any failure of the thermoregulatory system. Instead, body temperature is carefully controlled at the lower level in order to generate energy savings. Torpor is not found in birds wintering in cold climates and is generally not used under severe cold even in those birds regularly practicing torpor. Presumably this is because energetic costs of rewarming become prohibitive at extremely low temperatures.

Birds can also respond to winter cold by behavioral adjustments. Most birds show postural changes in the cold, such as tucking their legs and bill into their feathers, thus reducing exposed surface area. Also, birds are adept at selecting favorable microclimates for roosting that protect them from wind, precipitation, and radiative cooling. For example, a number of small birds roost in cavities (woodpeckers, nuthatches, chickadees), while others roost in thick foliage, principally conifers. In the latter case, goldfinches may save up to 50% on their overnight energy expenditures by roosting in thick foliage rather than in the open. For juncos, the energy savings appears more modest, but still amounts to 10% of overnight energy costs. Several birds, including some Galliformes and a few passerines such as redpolls and tits, use

snow burrows for roosting, which result in substantial energy savings. Generally these burrows remain open for the passerines, but are often closed for the Galliformes. A few birds, including creepers, bushtits, Northern Bobwhite, and Gray Partridge, huddle in small groups during cold weather. Bushtits can save 20% or more on overnight energy expenditures simply by huddling in pairs, while partridges can save up to 24% by huddling in small groups. Northern Bobwhite huddle in circular formations, with tails toward the center and heads facing outward. Huddles become tighter as temperatures fall.

Finally, some birds show adjustments in feeding behavior in response to winter cold. Greater foraging intensities in cold weather relative to warmer weather have been documented for a number of birds. Common Redpolls begin foraging at lower light intensities in the winter than in the summer, which is of obvious advantage, considering the short days available for foraging throughout its winter range. A number of birds, including chickadees, nuthatches, jays, and some woodpeckers, cache food to provide readily available food sources throughout the

winter.

Taken together, the physical, physiological, and behavioral adjustments that are available to wintering birds provide an arsenal for dealing with environmental conditions that seem downright unlivable to us. BANDING AT ABERDEEN, SOUTH DAKOTA, 1995 – 1996: WITH NOTES ON THE HOUSE FINCH INVASION

This paper reports the results of my banding at Aberdeen, SD, for 1995 – 1996. All banding was done in my residential backyard at 1709 North Jay Street. Results, presented in Table 2, compare these two years of banding with the previous ten, all from the same banding station.

The most striking ornithological development during the past decade has been the invasion of the House Finch into eastern South Dakota. As shown in Table 1, this species has skyrocketed since the late 1980's. This population explosion is dramatically reflected in the banding data. Only four birds were captured in 1990, while, just six years later, 542 were banded. Four recoveries have been made of these banded House Finches: two from North Dakota, one from the Selby corner, and one from Huron. It would appear that this species is developing migratory patterns in South Dakota, as it has elsewhere in the eastern United States. None of the House Finches showed effects of the conjunctivitis afflicting more eastern populations of this species until December 1996.

Two other local recoveries are of interest. An adult female Common Grackle that I banded on 5 June 1989 was retrapped on 27 July 1996 (band 1433-30934) and thus was at least seven years old. Another grackle banded as a first year bird of unknown sex on 18 June 1989 was retrapped

on 24 July 1996 (band 1423-65691), and was thus seven years old.

The most striking anomaly in the data in Table 2 is the massive increase in numbers of American Tree Sparrows banded in 1996 (255 vs. an average of 13.1) Almost all of these were banded in the snowy, wet spring. I have no ready explanation for the increase. Did this species undergo a population explosion? Did the wet conditions in the countryside force birds into the city? Or, perhaps, the discovery of urban feeders is fortuitous and subsequent individuals were attracted to the feeder by earlier migrants.

Two other examples of higher than expected numbers were Red-breasted Nuthatches and Ruby-crowned Kinglets in 1995. Sixty nuthatches were banded; the previous high had been 25. An invasion of this species was noted across the state during 1995. Fifty -seven kinglets were banded.

A decrease in neotropical migrants was not noted in the report period. A number of birds were banded in record numbers in 1996. These include Least Flycatchers and Swainson's Thrushes. One reason for this increase may be that I banded birds for about 10 extra days in May, compared with previous years.

GENERAL NOTES

CLARK'S GREBE-WESTERN GREBE PAIR AT SAND LAKE. On 25 June 1996, we drove to Sand Lake NWR in search of Clark's Grebes reported to us by Eric Likness. Eric directed us to the picnic area south of the head-quarters, but, finding no birds there, we drove to the lake shore drive directly east of the headquarters. We had barely turned onto the road before we spotted a pair of grebes. The larger of the two birds (both in body and bill size) was clearly a Clark's Grebe. This bird, presumably a male, had an eye surrounded by a large area of white. The female, carrying a relatively large chick on her back, however, was definitely a Western Grebe.

Her eye was surrounded by black.

The male dove and disappeared. We began to doubt our identification. Was this really a hybrid pair? We reconfirmed the identity of the female. The male was still nowhere in sight. We got out of the car and walked toward the lake. We discovered the male at close range, where he had resurfaced near the shore, out of sight from the road. This bird was definitely a Clark's Grebe. Compared to the Western Grebe, the Clark's bill was much clearer yellow and was generally much paler than that of his mate. The male dove again and resurfaced nearer to the female, who remained about 90 meters from the shore. In his bill, he carried what appeared to be a small bullhead, the size of a large minnow. The female immediately swam toward the male. He swam near her, carrying the bullhead all the while. It appeared to us that the male was waiting for the fish to die. After a couple of minutes, the male allowed the female to take the fish from his bill. She held it for a few seconds and then the bullhead disappeared down her gullet. During this whole sequence, the young bird road motionlessly on the female's back.

Storer and Nuechterlein (1993. The Birds of North America 26:17-22) state that, although intermediate-plumaged birds appear in most populations, suspected hybrids are relatively uncommon. Mixed species pairs comprise less than 5% of populations in Oregon. They further report that hybrids appear to be fertile but are less likely to find mates early in courtship. MOCKINGBIRDS IN ABERDEEN. A pair of mockingbirds made their appearance in Aberdeen on 5 November 1995, a cool but clear day. I first heard, then spotted the birds in a large cottonwood tree bordering a school playground in the southwest part of town. The two appeared to be sparing for rights to the tree and, at times, even appeared to be displaying. I was able to get within 20 feet of the birds and they seemed little disturbed by me. The white on the wings and tail, plus the slender, thrasher-like appearance, cinched the identification. Both birds also were very evident when they flew from branch to branch. COLOR-BANDED HOUSE FINCHES. House Finches have been color-banded in and around Mankato and North Mankato, MN. We ask that observers be alert to possible sightings of these birds. Each bird wears a U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service band plus three colored bands, so that there are two bands on each leg. The possible colored bands are as follows: red, orange, yellow, dark green, light green, dark blue, light blue, and white. It is important that we know the exact combination of the metal and colored bands carried on each leg. WHITE-FACED IBIS IN HYDE COUNTY. On 25 August 1996, Jim Faulstich called to say that earlier in the week he had seen about 40 flying birds near Lake Louise, in Hyde Co. He believed they were White-faced Ibis, I arrived at the site at 6 PM and saw seven White-faced Ibis feeding. We watched with binoculars for about 20 minutes and snapped some photos. Then Jim took the camera and walked slowly towards the birds and got a closer snapshot. The photos show the coloring and down-curved bills. We don't have a pervious record of the species in Hyde Co. June Harter, PO Box 236, Highmore, SD 57345.

BLACK-THROATED BLUE WARBLER IN HYDE COUNTY. On 4 October 1996, when I walked into the garage, I heard the familiar sound of a bird fluttering at the window, noticed that it was a warbler, and caught it. I checked its markings carefully before turning it loose. It was a male Black-throated Blue Warbler, with a blue-gray back edged with black on the sides, black throat, white underparts, and pointed warbler beak and size. The time was about 5:30 PM on a nice day. I have previous records of the species in my yard. June Harter, PO Box 236, Highmore, SD 57345.

WINTER SIGHTING OF LINCOLN'S SPARROW IN STANLEY COUNTY. While participating in the Pierre-Fort Pierre Christmas Bird Count on 16 December 16 1995, we observed a single Lincoln's Sparrow. We saw the bird at 2:15 PM along a dirt road running through land managed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, approximately 2.5 miles northwest of Oahe Dam. The bird was feeding on seeds on and along the dirt road. Surrounding habitat was mostly native rangeland. The bird allowed us to approach to within eight feet and was viewed with binoculars and the naked eye.

The Lincoln's Sparrow is considered an uncommon to fairly common migrant in South Dakota. *The Birds of South Dakota* (1991) lists the latest documented fall migration date as 5 November 1977, in Fall River County. Its typical winter distribution includes extreme southern British

Columbia south to Baja California, east through the southern parts of the southwestern states as far east as southern Missouri, south through Mexico and portions of Central America (Ammon, E. M. 1995. Lincoln's Sparrow (*Melospiza lincolnii*). In The Birds of North America, No. 191 (A. Poole and F. Gill, eds.). The Academy of Natural Sciences, Philadelphia, and The American Ornithologists' Union, Washington, D.C.)

Although not a typical bird feeder visitor, Lincoln's Sparrows were reported 56 times to the Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology's Project FeederWatch in 1995. Most reports were of one to two birds at a time, primarily from California, Washington, New Mexico, and Texas (Diane Tessaglia, pers. comm.). The Rare Bird Records Committee of the South Dakota Ornithologists' Union categorized this report as a Class 2 sighting. Eileen Dowd Stukel and James Stukel, 119 N. Madison, Pierre, SD 57501



BOOK REVIEWS

BIRDER'S GUIDE TO TEXAS—Edward A. Kutac. 1993. Gulf Publishing Company, Houston. 282 pp. Soft bound \$13.95.

BIRDER'S GUIDE TO FRANCE—Ligue Francaise pour la Protection des Oiseaux. 1992. Gulf Publishing Company, Houston. 282 pp. Soft bound \$16.95.

A BIRDER'S WEST INDIES—Roland H. Wauer. 1996. University of Texas Press, Austin. 238 pp. Soft bound \$19.95.

Our "snow birds," people who flee frigid South Dakota in the winter, will be interested in the *Birder's Guide to Texas*. It will certainly direct the reader to birding locations. The text includes maps and black and white illustrations. The latter are superfluous; they are nice but do not add to bird finding or identification. The maps seem woefully undetailed and do not include a scale of miles. This omission will make finding precise locations extremely difficult. The book ends with a collection of appendices, including a taxonomic list of Texas birds, Texas bird organizations (which will be of particular aid to the bird finder), and scientific bird collections in Texas.

Birder's going farther afield to France will have similar problems with the Birder's Guide to France. At least here the maps have a mileage (kilometer) scale. Again, the maps seem rather crude. Perhaps we are spoiled by the excellent maps in Eckert's Bird Finding in Minnesota. Again the text is illustrated with superfluous birds, space that could have been better used for larger maps or more birding locations. This book is certainly worth taking with you to France—you will be led in the proper direction and may be given some inspiration for places to visit. However, it may not lead you to exact spots for specific birds, although there are a few exceptions, where directions for individual species are given.

The third book, on the West Indies, is an interesting one. It begins with the usual bird finding book information on local logistics and personal concerns, as well as a bird list showing on which islands the vari-

ous birds are found. The bulk of the book is an essay describing the author's search for endemic West Indian birds. This makes enjoyable reading, even if the West Indies are but a frozen South Dakota dream. But be warned, the title is somewhat misleading, since not all the West Indian islands are covered, even in brief.

For the islands that are covered, it is nearly impossible to locate where the author found birds. Except for one map of the West Indies, there are no maps at all! A frustrating example of the inadequacy of this book is in the following passage, describing Jamaica, "We had spent a good part of the day with Robert Sutton at his 300-acre ranch and bird preserve [Marshall's Pen] and had taken his advice on the birdiest route across the Cockpit Country Uplands." Where is this ranch? What route did they take? We know what birds to look for, but we don't know precise locations to search. Dan Tallman, Northern State University, Aberdeen SD 57401.

THE PRINCETON FIELD GUIDE TO THE BIRDS OF AUSTRALIA—Ken Simpson and Nicolas Day. 1996. Princeton University Press, Princeton. 400 pp. Soft bound \$39.50.

I wish I had this book when I visited Australia. Really it is two books in one. First is a field guide with excellent color illustrations, complete with Peterson-like arrows pointing out salient field marks. Maps and brief species accounts are presented on the page facing each plate. The accounts include a description of plumage, voice, and habitat. The maps are small but adequate. Placed between the map and the species account is often a small black and white illustration depicting some aspect of the bird in question—special field marks, behaviors, or nests.

Two of the illustrations, which are uniformly stunning, deserve particular comment: 1) button quails flying away from the observer are shown headless—just as you might see them in the field; and 2) this is the only field guide I know that shows a dead bird—a White-throated Swift lying on its back on the ground, deader than a door nail. It's not that this species is so rare that dead is the only way you are likely to see it; I suspect the artist became giddy from drawing from too many museum spec-

imens.

The second book (the last quarter of the text) is called a handbook. It includes sections on the ecology and biogeography of Australia and a summary of Australian bird families, complete with many suggestions for further reading. There is simply a lot of information in these pages and would make great reading. Subjects include birding hints, noteworthy behaviors, and a lot of ecology. Included with the family accounts are graphs showing the breeding seasons of all species. The book also reports on the taxonomic conclusions wrought by recent DNA hybridization studies.

If I could go back to Australia and only take one book, this would be it. One final note: the title is a little misleading. This Princeton Press book is actually a new edition of a Penguin book, Field Guide to the Birds of Australia. Thus, to call it the Princeton Guide is a bit misleading as it suggests a completely original book, rather than something that has been previously available outside of the United States. SEASONAL REPORTS

The 1996 Fall Season

Reports were received for 303 species; for comparison, there were only 276 species reported during the fall season last year. A first state record Eurasian Collared Dove and possible first state records for Mew Gull and Black-chinned Hummingbird would have to be considered highlights. Other noteworthy sightings include Red-throated Loon, Brown Pelican, Brant, Surf Scoter, Blacknecked Stilt, Pomarine Jaeger, Thaver's Gull, Black-legged Kittiwake, Sabine's Gull, Calliope Hummingbird, Broad-tailed Hummingbird, Rufous Hummingbird, Prothonotary Warbler, and Lesser Goldfinch. The Rare Bird Records Committee should have an active agenda for its next meeting! As always, I have tried to highlight the more significant sightings (dates which are earlier/later than listed in The Birds of South Dakota and species which are out of rangel. For early/late migration dates, I have listed the three earliest/latest dates (by county); however, if these did not include a sighting East River, West River, and along the Missouri River, I have given the earliest/latest date in the missing region also. The table below presents some of the migration "trends" which I would like to begin tracking with the seasonal reports; averages are from the 1994 and 1995 fall seasons. Comments and additional ideas are certainly welcome.
