



A Surprise for the Teacher!

On the morning of July 9, 2014, one of my kindergarten boys called me on his mom's cell phone inviting me to his great grandparents' old abandoned farmstead to see a cool bird in an upstairs room. Neither the child nor his mother would tell me what the bird was, so it was a mystery. I got the directions from his mom and quickly headed out to the destination.

I met them at the farmhouse on that very hot morning and they were all smiles. We went into the old, spooky, smelly house. The windows were broken and there was trash scattered all over. The little boy told me to watch out for raccoons because the last time he was there, a raccoon crawled out from inside the couch.

While we were climbing the creaky stairs, I was a bit nervous about falling through the rickety stairs or meeting a raccoon at the top of the steps. I noticed the stairs were littered with many pieces of what looked like feces. After the three of us got near the upstairs room, the boy asked me if I wanted to go first. I laughed and said, "No." I didn't know what would be in there. As we quietly stepped into the old bedroom, a large, white and tan bird flew towards us, veered to the left and ran into the window! It quickly got back up and flew out an exit hole in the closet. The little boy ran to the closet and called me over to look. As he shone a flashlight in the closet, I heard this surprisingly loud hissing sound. There on the floor were seven young, downy Barn Owls sitting atop a pile of owl pellets! I had never seen Barn Owlets before, and they were so interesting as they swayed back and forth while hissing at us. It was apparent which two were the last hatched, as they looked markedly different and were smaller.



We stayed for a short time to observe them, while I quickly took a few photos and a short video. Then we left them, so their parent could return. On our way down the stairs, I realized that the many odd, feces-like pieces on the steps were owl pellets. The little boy was so proud to show me those owlets and I was thrilled to have seen them!

Twelve days later, on July 20th, I went back to check on the owlets and this time I invited birder Ron Mabie along. The owlets were beginning to molt and some brown plumage was coming through the white down feathers.

Five days later on July 25th, Dave Swanson and I were scanning an enormous flock of shorebirds at the nearby Lake Andes National Wildlife Refuge. I asked him to stop by to see the young Barn Owls on his way home. This time the owlets were swaying and snapping their bills at us. Their brown and dark gray feathers were more prominent. The two smallest Barn Owls had filled out and were resembling their siblings a bit more. They all huddled in the corner facing us. Their heart-shaped faces and facial discs were distinct, as were their black eyes.

I share this story along with the photos and video with my bird-y kindergartners and Chickadee Bird Club each year. They love that a 6-year-old made this discovery and I love that this little boy invited me to see them. I'm so glad my students have a passion for birds like I do!

Book Review: All the Birds of the World

All the Birds of the World. Josep del Hoyo, ed. 967 pp. Lynx Ediciones: Barcelona. Hardbound. \$125.

This book is amazing. If you are interested in birds, or if you need a gift for someone who is, take a look at this volume. This 967-page book contains a series of excellent color illustrations of all of the 11,324 known bird species of the world. For each species, both sexes are illustrated, if they differ, and many races are included—20,865 illustrations in all.

The sample page below gives you an idea of the book's layout. Each species is framed in a section that includes a range map, a notation of the bird's conservation status, a red circle that indicates if ornithologists disagree about the taxonomic status of the bird, and alternate common and scientific names. There are check boxes for your own lists. Even the approximately 150 species known to have become extinct since 1500 are included in an appendix. The book also includes a 37-page world atlas with details of interest to amateur birders and ornithologists. This book may strike you as fairly expensive at \$125,



but, as the publishers proclaim, it is the "easiest and most enjoyable way to browse through all the birds

of the world."



But it gets better! Included with each illustration is a QR code that, when read by your cell phone, links you to that species' account in eBird's collection of videos, photos and sound recordings. The result is a mega reference book that can be enjoyed by anyone interested in birds.

Stella the Snowy Owl winters in South Dakota

This past winter (December 2020 – February 2021), a Snowy Owl wearing a transmitter spent more than a month in north-central South Dakota. 'Stella' was captured and fitted with her GSM transmitter on Amherst Island at the northeastern corner of Lake Ontario on January 15, 2018, as part of a study of the impact of wind turbines on Snowy Owl movements. At the time, researchers determined that she hatched in summer 2017. She then proceeded north, spending the next three summers in different parts of the Arctic tundra and spending winters in the northern Great Plains. She spent the winter of 2018-19 in northeastern Montana, the winter of 2019-20 in southern Manitoba, and the winter of 2020-21 in North and South Dakota. On December 27, 2020, Stella entered Corson County and proceeded to work her way southwest; spending quite a bit of time south of Lantry in northern Dewey County. In late January she moved northwest into the Meadow area of Perkins County before exiting the state on February 1, 2021. She spent much of the rest of the winter in the Van Hook Arm area of Lake Sakakawea in North Dakota. More information about Stella and her movements is at projectsnowstorm.org.

Stella's location data was collected by a GPS-GSM solar-powered transmitter (made by Cellular Tracking Technologies of Rio Grande, NJ) which rides on her back. Every two hours the transmitter communicated with GPS satellites to record her precise position (latitude, longitude, and altitude) with an accuracy of less than 1 meter (Therrien et al. 2012). Thus, we have more than 600 location points covering the time Stella was in South Dakota. When Stella is within cell tower range, the information is uploaded immediately to project computers. When she is not within range, such as during the summer when she is north of the Arctic circle, her transmitter can store up to 100,000 records which then is uploaded the next time she is within cell tower range. Project SNOWstorm (projectsnowstorm.org) is a non-profit organization that raises funds to purchase the transmitters, as well as organize the capture and fitting of transmitters to Snowy Owls. To date, they have put transmitters on 48 owls. The data from all of these birds are stored at Movebank (Wikelski et. al. 2021), an online data platform that helps researchers manage, share, analyze and archive their animal movement data.

Stella's transmitter provides unbiased location information that is particularly good for habitat use studies. For example, some past studies of habitat selection by wintering snowy owls in the Great Plains relied on visual observations of birds (e.g., Boxall and Lein 1982). By necessity, these studies did not include night-time locations, when owls are most active, nor observations of owls that were behind a hill or otherwise out of sight, making the results less useful for insights on snowy owl ecology. In a preliminary peek at Stella's movements in South Dakota, it appears that Stella was choosing particular habitats rather than using all available habitats equally. In addition, Stella is not the only Project SNOWstorm owl to spend time in our state. For example, 'Coteau' spent much of the month of February 2020 in Grant and Codington counties. Researchers will be looking more closely at Stella's and other owls' winter movements and habitat use in order to understand how Snowy Owls are using the landscape, especially in the Dakotas.

Avian Surveys at Canyon Lake, Rapid City, SD: Flycatchers through Waxwings Species Accounts

INTRODUCTION

This is the third of a series of accounts of species found on weekly avian surveys conducted at Canyon Lake in Rapid City, SD from October 2010 through February 2019. Previously (Hess 2019, 2020a, 2020b) I described the results for the non-passerine species found on the surveys. Here I report the results for the first 38 songbird species.

METHODS

The field survey methods are described in Hess (2019).




Fig. 1. Seasonal Bar Graph key.

In the following species accounts, seasonal occurrence percentages are the number of surveys the species occurred on in that season divided by total number of surveys in that season. Seasonal bar graphs were constructed for the period October 2010 through September 2018. Months are divided into quarters as follows: January, March, May, July, August, October, December 1–7, 8–15, 16–23, 24–31; February, April, June, September, November 1–7, 8–14, 15–22, 23–30. The bar heights from short to tall represent the following abundance categories: 1–3, 4–10, 11–100, 101–1,000. Isolated records are shown as a dot. A bar of narrow width indicates irregular occurrence, usually at the beginning or end of migration (Fig. 1).

SPECIES ACCOUNTS

Olive-sided Flycatcher: One individual of this rare migrant (Tallman et al. 2002) occurred on 12 May 2014.




Fig. 2. Western Wood-Pewee seasonal occurrence.

Western Wood-Pewee: Found commonly in the Black Hills (Tallman et al. 2002, Drilling et al. 2018), Western Wood-Pewee occurred on the survey 11 times and was found in spring and fall (Fig. 2). The June observations were of single birds.

Willow Flycatcher: Uncommon in west river (Drilling et al. 2018), one was present on 29 May 2017.

Least Flycatcher: This uncommon summer resident (Tallman et al. 2002, Drilling et al. 2018) was recorded eight times in May and once in August. One or two was the usual count but four were found on 14 May 2018.




Fig. 3. Cordilleran Flycatcher seasonal occurrence.

Cordilleran Flycatcher: One or two individuals of this Black Hills summer resident (Drilling et al. 2018) were heard throughout every summer of the count (Fig. 3). Because the birds were singing from across the lake on inaccessible property we were unable to confirm breeding.

Eastern Phoebe: Rare in far western South Dakota (Tallman et al. 2002), 2 birds were found on 9, 16 June 2014, 1 on 18 April 2016, and 1 on 20 August 2018.

Western Kingbird: Single birds were found in August and September on four occasions.




Fig. 4. Eastern Kingbird seasonal occurrence.

Eastern Kingbird: Present on 55.7% of the summer surveys this summer resident (Fig. 4) was confirmed nesting in 2014 and 2018. A pair was present during June in 2015, 2016, and 2017 but nesting was not confirmed.

Warbling Vireo: One or two birds of this common breeding bird (Drilling et al. 2018) were present in five years. The only suggestion of possible breeding was in 2011 when 1 – 2 birds were present on the 6, 20, and 27 June surveys. Most other observations were in mid- to late May (2) or mid-August (2). One on 2 July 2012 and 1 July 2013 were likely wandering birds. The latest was 1 on 19 August 2015.




Fig. 5. Red-eyed Vireo seasonal occurrence.

Red-eyed Vireo: One or two were present, at least briefly, in the breeding season in most years (Fig. 5). This scarce South Dakota breeding bird (Drilling et al. 2018) was found throughout the breeding season in 2013 and 2014. It was not confirmed as a breeding bird.




Fig. 6. Blue Jay seasonal occurrence.

Blue Jay: This conspicuous resident (Fig. 6) species was found on 62.9% of all surveys. On 5 June 2017 a nest with 2 young was found. Three young were observed on 2 July 2018.




Fig. 7. American Crow seasonal occurrence.

American Crow: This resident species (Fig. 7) was observed on 95.7% of all counts. Because birds frequently were seen flying throughout a survey only the highest number seen at one time was recorded. Breeding was confirmed with the presence of 3 young on 18 June 2012 and 2 young on 11 July 2016.

Horned Lark: Two individuals of this prairie species were found on 19 March 2018 for the only known park occurrence.




Fig. 8. Northern Rough-winged Swallow seasonal occurrence.

Northern Rough-winged Swallow: The spring high count was 100 on 9 May 2011. This summer resident (Drilling et al. 2018, Fig. 8), found on 85.7% of summer surveys, was confirmed breeding on 27 June 2016 when 3 fledglings were observed. Prior to the dam renovation this swallow was seen entering and leaving drain pipes below the spillway. Presumably nests were present in the pipes. The renovation removed these drain pipes. The fall high count was 20 on 10 August 2015.




Fig. 9. Tree Swallow seasonal occurrence.

Tree Swallow: Most abundant during spring migration, the high count was 200 on 20 May 2013. Most migrants have passed through by mid-May (Fig. 9). It was found on 62.9% of the summer surveys. This common breeding bird (Drilling et al. 2018) is limited at Canyon Lake by available nesting cavities. One nest box was present and was often investigated. Tree Swallows were observed using the box in June 2012. Fall migration begins in August. The peak fall count was 100 on 20 August 2018.




Fig. 10. Violet-green Swallow seasonal occurrence.

Violet-green Swallow: This swallow is fairly common in spring and fall migration (Fig. 10). The earliest arrival was 1 on 16 April 2012. One extraordinary occurrence was an estimated 800 on 7 May 2012. Although present throughout the summer, found on 97.1% of summer surveys, breeding was not confirmed. They may have nested in nearby cliff faces or in cavities near the park. Peak fall numbers were 100 on 25 August 2014, and 29 August 2015. The latest fall occurrence was 3 on 7 September 2015.




Fig. 11. Barn Swallow seasonal occurrence.

Barn Swallow: This widespread swallow was uncommon in spring migration to late June (Fig. 11). It was found on all summer surveys and was confirmed nesting in all survey years. One or two nests were consistently found on gazebo island and occasionally in a picnic shelter. The high count was 62 on 25 August 2014.




Fig. 12. Cliff Swallow seasonal occurrence.

Cliff Swallow: The earliest arrival was 3 on 18 April 2015. Abundant during spring and summer (Fig. 12) this swallow annually attempted to nest at the lake. Nests were constructed on the Chapel Lane bridge or the bridge leading to the gazebo island. As many 100 nests could be constructed in a season. In some years the nests were abandoned before the end of the nesting season. It was found on 95.7% of the summer surveys. The latest departure was 1 on 7 September 2015.




Fig. 13. Black-capped Chickadee seasonal occurrence.

Black-capped Chickadee: This resident was usually uncommon with 2 – 4 birds being recorded (Fig. 13). High counts of 10 – 15 were reached on 16 occasions. No breeding was observed. It was found on 87.5% of all surveys.




Fig. 14. Red-breasted Nuthatch seasonal occurrence.

Red-breasted Nuthatch: This uncommon resident (Fig. 14) was found on 38.3% of surveys most often in the fall (40.7% of fall surveys). Usually only 1 or 2 birds were found but a high count of 5 was reached on 7 November 2016. No evidence of nesting in the park was found.




Fig. 15. White-breasted Nuthatch seasonal occurrence.

White-breasted Nuthatch: Found throughout the year this nuthatch was uncommon (Fig. 15), found on only 22% of the surveys. Usually only single individuals were found. No evidence of breeding was noted.

Pygmy Nuthatch: Rare in the Black Hills (Drilling et al. 2018) and absent elsewhere in South Dakota (Tallman et al. 2002). Two found on 26 July 2012 and one on 14 December 2015 were the only occurrences.

Brown Creeper: This regular but uncommon winter (Tallman et al. 2002) visitor was found in numbers of 1-3 on 41.4% of the winter surveys (Fig. 16).




Fig. 17. House Wren seasonal occurrence.

House Wren: Found on only 19 surveys it was rarely observed beyond June. This wren did not nest at Canyon Lake (Fig. 17). Usually only a single bird was found. The few nest boxes in the park were damaged and therefore unappealing to the wrens.

Marsh Wren: This is an uncommon west river migrant (Tallman et al. 2002). Single birds were found on 29 April 2013, 5 October 2015, 25 September 2017, and 30 April 2018. All were found in the small cattail marsh on the west edge of the park.

Golden-crowned Kinglet: This uncommon resident in the higher Black Hills (Tallman et al. 2002) was a winter visitor to Canyon Lake. Typically only one or two individuals were found (Fig, 18). A high count of 6 occurred on 18 February 2019. Late occurrences are 4 on 26 March 2014 and 2 on 9 April 2018.

Ruby-crowned Kinglet: A common summer resident in higher elevations of the Black Hills (Tallman et al. 2002). One to four individuals of this irregularly occurring species were recorded in every month but March, September, and November.

Eastern Bluebird: The only occurrence of this uncommon migrant (Tallman et al. 2002) was 1 on 8

October 2012.

Mountain Bluebird: Nesting commonly in the Black Hills (Drilling et al. 2018) the only observations were five on 28 March 2011 and two on 24 April 2013.




Fig. 19. Townsend's Solitaire seasonal occurrence.

Townsend's Solitaire: This uncommon Black Hills resident (Tallman et al. 2002) visited the park from fall to early spring. Usually only one individual was recorded (Fig. 19). The summer observations, each of a single bird, likely were wandering birds.

Swainson's Thrush: This common migrant (Tallman et al. 2002) has occurred twice in May and once in September in both 2012 and 2013. The only time more than 1 bird was present was on 13 May 2013 when 5 were found.




Fig. 20. American Robin seasonal occurrence.

American Robin: This familiar bird was fairly common in spring and fall migration and uncommon or absent at other seasons (Fig. 20). It was found on 57.9% of all surveys. The high count was 96 on 17 October 2016. Nesting in the park was confirmed in 2011 and 2015.




Fig. 21. Gray Catbird seasonal occurrence.

Gray Catbird: One to three individuals of this irregularly occurring species were found in most years, usually in the fall (Fig. 21). A lack of thickets in the park probably best explains the low numbers and irregular occurrence of this common species.

Brown Thrasher: Single individuals were found in September 2010, May 2013 and 2015, and July 2015. Like Gray Catbird, a lack of thickets in the park probably best explains the low numbers and irregular occurrence of this common species.




Fig. 22. European Starling seasonal occurrence.

European Starling: This fairly common resident, found on 89.4% of all counts, was seen feeding, roosting or flying over the park (Fig. 22). It was confirmed nesting in the park in 2011, 2014, and 2017. The peak count was 130 on 14 August 2017.

American Pipit: This is an uncommon to common fall migrant (Tallman et al. 2002). This unexpected visitor occurred in the park on four dates: 4 on 16 April 2012, 2 on 10 September 2012, 2 on 15 October 2012, and 2 on 24 April 2017.

Bohemian Waxwing: One individual of this winter irruptive species was found on 12 February 2014.




Fig. 23. Cedar Waxwing seasonal occurrence.

Cedar Waxwing: This fairly common to common bird was found on 90% of the summer surveys (Fig. 23). The June decline in abundance probably reflects birds at nests. Nesting was not confirmed. In warmer months they were often seen fly-catching from trees along various channels running through the park. That there are relatively few berry bearing trees in the park is the most likely explanation for the erratic winter occurrence.

There were 311 species, including 10 rarities (Western Sandpiper, Arctic Tern, Red-shouldered Hawk, White-eyed Vireo, Pacific Wren, West River sightings of Buff-breasted Sandpiper, LeConte's Sparrow, and Swamp Sparrow, and the first state record of Painted Redstart) reported to the SDOU online database during the 2020 Fall season. The ten-year (2010-2019) average is 318. Below, I have tried to highlight the more significant sightings (early/late dates as given in the online database, first county records, or species that are significantly out of range). For early/late migration dates, I have listed the three earliest/latest dates. However, if these did not include a sighting East River, West River, and along the Missouri River, I have included the earliest/latest reported date from the missing region also. Included at the end of this report is a list of species that were not reported this year but might be expected during the Fall Season. A species is placed on the list if it was not reported this year but had been reported during fall in at least 2 of the previous 5 years. Numbers in parentheses indicate the number of consecutive years (up to 4) that the species has appeared on the list during the season.
