Ever since I became passionate about birds, I've wanted others to be interested in birds as well. These last ten years, I have incorporated birds and nature into my kindergarten curriculum. My students become experts on bird identification and bird song recognition by the end of the school year, often being able to identify 300-400 species. The best part is that they become passionate about birds and have greatly improved nature awareness. As they get older, many students join my Chickadee Bird Club that meets weekly. This past year, there were 42 members from grades 1-6. We went birding in town or had lessons in the classroom. We loved being together and talking about birds!

I make sure that each student has a bird field guide of their own and I encourage them to study it at home. For example, if waterfowl migration is about to begin, I ask them to try to learn the waterfowl in their field guide. Then we study it at Bird Club too.



I teach the common birds first by comparing a bird's size to the American Robin, which is a helpful reference point. I also have acquired over 30 pair of good binoculars from kind people and businesses, and I teach them how to use binoculars, so they can observe nature more closely.

No matter the age of the person, I think it is good to teach others how to go birding and be mindful in nature. I encourage them to walk a bit slower and try to be somewhat quiet. I ask students to be careful observers by stopping often and watching for movement, while listening for sounds. I challenge students to notice if a bird is carrying nesting material in its bill or if it is carrying food, etc. They catch on to this quickly and I enjoy hearing their bird reports.

I often incorporate a 5-minute observation time where I ask my young birders to spread out, be perfectly quiet and still while they look and listen to their surroundings. Then we gather to discuss what they observed.

If you take children birding, understand that they will want to investigate birds, but also turtles, frogs and flowers. Perhaps they will want to throw rocks in the water too, but that is perfectly normal and important for them to experience.

As people become increasingly immersed in technology, they are spending much more time indoors. Anything we can do to offset that would be important and getting others out in nature may make a difference in their lives. Exploring varied habitats is interesting and you never know when they will see that "spark bird." In time, they may learn how calming it is to be out in nature. I challenge you to do what you can to get others outdoors. The ripple effects may continue through generations!

SDOU 2022 Spring Meeting Report

The 2022 SDOU Spring Meeting was in Belle Fourche, South Dakota on April 29, 30 and May 1. On Friday, April 29 we met at the Branding Iron Steakhouse in Belle Fourche. It was great to be back together in person after two years without meetings due to the pandemic. The evening's presentation was: *Forest Management and Bird Projects in the Northern Black Hills* by Ruben Mares, who works for the Forest Service out of Spearfish.

The SDOU Spring Board of Director's Meeting was held on Saturday afternoon with 19 members present in-person or via Zoom. We had a good discussion and set our Fall meeting to be in Sioux Falls on September 30 - October 2, 2022.

Saturday evening's banquet was very nice as well with great food and conversation. The evening presentation was: Of Birds and Herds: Grassland Bird Conservation on Working Rangelands in Northwest South Dakota. The speaker was Jessica Howell of the American Bird Conservancy out of the Buffalo, NRCS office. She talked about the partnerships she is fostering between private landowners and government agencies to improve habitat for Long-billed Curlews and other prairie birds in northwest South Dakota.

On Saturday and Sunday, April 30 and May 1, we had three field trips. Saturday was a cold, windy day, but us hardy birders made the best of it, while Sunday's weather was much better.

Field Trip 1: Butte County with Scott Stolz and Barry Parkin - Early Sunday morning, SDOU members were fortunate to have a nice, long look at the Greater Sage-Grouse lek. There were 16+ grouse and we observed males displaying. Then a coyote loped in and scared them away. Afterwards, Chuck Berdan talked to the group about his experiences doing surveys on Greater Sage-Grouse through the years. Before we left, someone spotted a Long-billed Curlew across the road. Afterwards, we birded around the area

and we were thrilled to find a female Thick-billed Longspur, a vocal Sage Thrasher, Chestnut-collared Longspurs and other prairie birds.

Field Trip 2: Northern Black Hills with Todd Jensen – Birders were able to hear the drumming Ruffed Grouse and an American Dipper feeding Its young. They also saw other Black Hills birds.

Field Trip 3: Orman Dam and Area Lakes with Nancy Drilling – My group observed 80+ species of birds on Saturday with highlights being Caspian Terns, Black-billed Magpies, Mountain Bluebirds, Loggerhead Shrike, Sharp-tailed Grouse, Willet and Common Loon.



A trip into Sturgis yielded the rare Golden-crowned Sparrow that Nancy Drilling found during the Christmas Bird Count.



As a group we saw 136 species of birds in the Belle Fourche area including northwestern (Harding, Butte, Meade) counties, northern Hills, and nearby prairie lakes (Orman Dam, Bear Butte Lake). You can see the full list on the SDOU web site at https://sdou.org/SDOU/Past.aspx

The Second Annual SDOU Collective Big Day 14 May 2022

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the in-person Spring 2021 SDOU meeting was cancelled. *In lieu* of an in-person spring SDOU meeting, SDOU initiated a collective Big Day on 15 May 2021. The event involved individuals or groups birding in an area of their choice in South Dakota, most often, although not exclusively, near their residence, although birding at any location or locations in South Dakota was allowed. The basic rules for the Collective Big Day were that each person or group kept a list of all species observed (seen or heard) during the day, which they submitted to the compiler, David Swanson of Vermillion. The lists also included all locations visited during the 24-hr period, but not separate bird lists for each location visited. Counts of individual bird species observed were also not recorded, only the species list. The inaugural SDOU Collective Big Day resulted in 26 lists submitted and 236 species observed (Swanson 2021 SDBN 73:25-26).

The SDOU Board of Directors voted in Spring 2021 to make the SDOU Collective Big Day an annual

event, loosely associated with Endangered Species Week, which occurs during the second or third week of May. SDOU hosted the second annual SDOU Big Day on 14 May 2022. Birding on the Big Day was allowed for the entire 24-hour period from midnight to midnight on 14 May, or any portion thereof, and the basic rules followed those established for the inaugural Collective Big Day in 2021.

For the second Collective Big Day, I received lists from twenty-nine different individuals or groups, ranging across the state from Harding County in the northwest to Pennington County in the central Black Hills to Roberts and Day counties in the northeast to Union County in the southeastern part of the state. The total species count recorded for the day was 230 species (Table 1), with top list honors going to Jeff Palmer and David Swanson, who conducted a Kingsbury County Big Day and netted 131 species. Rare birds detected on the Big Day included Kentucky Warbler (Richmond Lake State Park, Brown Co.), "Brewster's" Warbler (hybrid between Golden-winged and Blue-winged warblers, Newton Hills State Park, Lincoln Co.), Cerulean Warbler (Sioux Falls), and Hooded Warbler (Newton Hills State Park, Lincoln Co.).

Despite a strong overall total of 230 species, just six species short of the 236-species total for the inaugural SDOU Collective Big Day, a number of regular species for South Dakota for the middle of May were missed. Some of the western breeding species hadn't arrived yet, which accounted for some of the missed species. In any event, 50 species that I consider to be regular migrants or breeding species (excluding species classified as rare) were missed on the Collective Big Day (Table 2), perhaps providing areas or bird species to target for next year. Let's see if we can beat the records of 29 lists submitted and 236 species observed when we conduct the 2023 SDOU Collective Big Day, tentatively scheduled for 13 May 2023.

First December Records for Savannah Sparrow and Baird's Sandpiper and First January Record for Pine Warbler in South Dakota

I was fortunate to observe three bird species classified as accidental during winter in South Dakota (Tallman et al. 2002) during the winter of 2021-2022 in southeastern South Dakota. All three records have



been approved by the Rare Bird Records Committee of the South Dakota Ornithologists' Union. I observed a Savannah Sparrow (*Passerculus sandwichensis*) on 11-12 December 2021 in a grassy/weedy ditch along 459th Avenue in Clay County, about ½-mile south of Highway 50 and approximately 3.5 miles northwest of Vermillion (Fig. 1). According to the South Dakota Ornithologists' Union (SDOU) Bird Observation Database (SDOU 2021), this record represents the first December observation of Savannah Sparrow for South Dakota, although one previous winter record exists for the state, from Lake Andes National Wildlife Refuge on 3 January 2012 (SDOU 2021).

Tallman et al. (2002) list no winter records of Savannah Sparrow for South Dakota, with the latest fall record of 18 November 2000 in Brookings County. Moreover, no eBird records exist for Savannah Sparrow in South Dakota after mid-November (eBird 2021). The northern boundary of the regular winter range of Savannah Sparrow in the central United States includes Oklahoma, extreme southeastern Kansas and southern Missouri (Wheelright and Rising 2020). In surrounding states, no records of Savannah Sparrow after mid- to late November exist for North Dakota and Wyoming, and the species is very rare in December through February for Minnesota (19 total December and January records, Minnesota Ornithologists' Union 2021), Montana and Iowa (eBird 2021). The species is listed as a rare casual winter visitor in Nebraska, in the south and east, and late December through early March records are increasing there in recent years (Silcock and Jorgensen 2021a).

I observed two Baird's Sandpipers (*Calidris bairdii*) on 14 December 2021 in Yankton County, along the north shore of the Missouri River approximately 400 m east of the outlet of Lake Yankton into the



Missouri River. Greg Pavelka photographed what was presumably one of these birds at the same location on 21 December 2021 (Fig. 2). These observations represent the first winter records for Baird's Sandpiper in South Dakota. The previous late fall date was 20 November 2004 (Swanson 2006).

The winter range of Baird's Sandpiper is typically in central to southern South America, but the species is accidental in winter in North America (Moskoff and Montgomerie 2020). As a side note, I observed a Baird's Sandpiper on the wintering range in a saline lagoon in the Atacama Desert of northern Chile in April of 2009. Nebraska has five winter records of Baird's Sandpiper, spanning from 1-23 December (Silcock and Jorgensen 2020). Late fall dates in Minnesota and Iowa are 25 November and 27 November, respectively (MOU 2021, Iowa Ornithologists' Union 2021). Records from eBird for nearby states in the central United States include observations through the first week of November for Montana and Wyoming, the third week of November for North Dakota, Minnesota, Nebraska, the last week of November for Iowa and Colorado, the first week of December for Kansas, and the second week of December for Oklahoma (eBird 2021).

Finally, I observed a Pine Warbler (Setophaga pinus) on 9 and 29 January 2022 near the Horse Camp Area

at Union Grove State Park, Union County, in an area dominated by eastern red cedars, *Juniperus virginiana* (Fig. 3). This observation represents the first January record for Pine Warbler from South Dakota, although two previous December records for this species exist for the state, from Meade and Yankton counties (SDOU 2021). The winter range of the Pine Warbler is primarily in the southeastern United States, with the northern boundary of the typical winter range in the central United States extending from eastern Oklahoma to northern Arkansas (Rodewald et al. 2020). The species is rare but regular in winter north of its typical winter range in the central and northeastern United States (Rodewald et al. 2020).

Silcock and Jorgensen (2021) list Pine Warbler as a rare casual winter visitor in east and central Nebraska. For states and provinces in north-central North America, no January eBird records of Pine Warbler exist for South Dakota, Nebraska or Manitoba (eBird 2021). Minnesota has eBird records from the first and last weeks of January, North Dakota from the last week of January, Iowa from the first, second and last weeks of January.



uary, and Wisconsin from all four weeks in January (eBird 2021). Iowa lists five winter records from 4 December through 10 February, collectively (IOU 2021), and Minnesota lists winter records from five counties, with these records extending as far north as St. Louis County (MOU 2021).

The observations of all three species are consistent with a trend of later fall migration with recent climate warming (van Buskirk et al. 2009, Ellwood et al. 2015, Miller et al. 2015). The observations of Savannah Sparrow and Pine Warbler might represent lingering fall migrants that settle to overwinter north of the typical wintering range as early winter temperatures increase in central North America (Tebaldi et al. 2013), a trend that has been documented previously (La Sorte and Thompson 2007, Niven et al. 2009). Swanson et al. (2020) documented patterns of recent increases in winter occurrence records in South Dakota for three formerly casual to accidental winter species, Hermit Thrush (*Catharus guttatus*), Fox Sparrow (*Passerella iliaca*), and Yellow-rumped Warbler (*Setophaga coronata*). Swanson et al. (2020) suggested that a combination of warming winters and red cedar expansion within the state might be responsible for increasing winter occurrences for these species in the state, as all three species will eat the fleshy cones (i.e., "berries") of cedars. This explanation might also apply to the Pine Warbler observation, as I found the bird in an area dominated by eastern red cedar and Pine Warblers also regularly consume fruit (Rodewald et al. 2020), so may also consume cedar "berries."

The 2021 Fall Season 01 August 2021 to 30 November 2021

There were 311 species, including 4 rarities (Mute Swan, Mississippi Kite, Hammond's Flycatcher, and White-eyed Vireo) reported to the SDOU online database during the 2021 Fall season. The ten-year (2011-2020) average is 317. Below, I have tried to highlight the more significant sightings (early/late dates as given in the online database or first county records in bold text, or species that are significantly out of range). For early/late migration dates, I have listed the three earliest/latest dates. However, if these did not include a sighting East River, West River, and along the Missouri River, I have included the earliest/latest reported date from the missing region also. Included at the end of this report is a list of species that were not reported this year but might be expected during the Fall Season. A species is placed on the list if it was not reported this year but had been reported during fall in at least 2 of the previous 5 years. Numbers in parentheses indicate the number of consecutive years (up to 4) that the species has appeared on the list during the season. Not reported during the fall season the last 5 years, Cassin's Kingbird was removed from the list.
